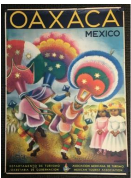

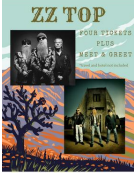

He served as the head coach at Mississippi State University (1954-1955), the University of Washington (1956), and the University of Texas (1957-1976), compiling a career college football record of 184-60-5. In his 20 seasons at Texas, Royal's teams won three national championships (1963, 1969, and 1970), 11 Southwest Conference titles, and amassed a record of 167-47-5. He won more games than any other coach in Texas Longhorns football history. He never had a losing season as a head coach for his entire career. Royal was an All-American at the University of Oklahoma, where he played football from 1946 to 1949. He was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame as a coach in 1983. Darrell K Royal?Texas Memorial Stadium in Austin, Texas, where the Longhorns play their home games, was renamed in his honor in 1996.
